REPORT FROM PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN FOR THE APRIL, 2019 NEWSLETTER



THANKS OFFERING BENEFICIEARIES-

Each year since 1888, Presbyterian Women have been encouraged to donate to the Thank Offering. Over the years, support has been given to thousands of ministries worldwide, and raised tens of millions of dollars for mission. In March of 2018, the Creative Ministries Offering Committee of Presbyterian Women reviewed 83 applications submitted for grants from the 2017 Thank Offering. Sixteen of the projects were chosen for funding. Twelve of the projects are ministries serving people in need in the United States. Four of the projects are international. More than 40 per cent of the projects funded are health ministries. The diversity of the projects is a powerful message about the needs of so many. One grant will provide security systems to a particular community of low income families that has experienced abuse, poverty, homelessness. Another will provide safe means to transport food to help a hunger community. Another will fund production costs for a filmed documentary that will explore the rights of refugees and immigrants through the lenses of people of faith. Another will provide mobile showers to people who are homeless in a county where 79% of the homeless live on the street. These are only a few examples of the projects funded for 2018. Anyone may contribute to the PW Thank Offering. Locally these donations are turned in in the Fall and then forwarded to join in the wider effort. Every dollar donated has the potential to have a huge impact.


Food Pantry Item for April Cold Cereal for kids (the food pantry is requesting cereal, they have a lot of children and they are really low in the cereal department)

Creamy Au Gratin Potatoes

Ingredients

4 russet potatoes, sliced into 1/4 inch slices

1 onion, sliced into rings

salt and pepper to taste

3 tablespoons butter

3 tablespoons all-purpose flour

1/2 teaspoon salt

2 cups milk

1 1/2 cups shredded Cheddar cheese

Directions

Preheat oven to 400 degrees F (200 degrees C). Butter a 1 quart casserole dish.

Layer 1/2 of the potatoes into bottom of the prepared casserole dish. Top with the onion slices, and add the remaining potatoes. Season with salt and pepper to taste.

In a medium-size saucepan, melt butter over medium heat. Mix in the flour and salt, and stir constantly with a whisk for one minute. Stir in milk. Cook until mixture has thickened. Stir in cheese all at once, and continue stirring until melted, about 30 to 60 seconds. Pour cheese over the potatoes, and cover the dish with aluminum foil.

Bake 1 1/2 hours in the preheated oven.

Lemon Icebox Pie III

Ingredients

1 (9 inch) prepared graham cracker crust

2 (8 ounce) packages cream cheese, softened

1 (14 ounce) can sweetened condensed milk


2 lemons, juiced

1 teaspoon lemon zest

Directions

In a medium mixing bowl, beat cream cheese until fluffy. Add condensed milk, lemon juice, and lemon rind. Mix until smooth. Pour mixture into crust. Refrigerate at least 2 hours before serving. Garnish with whipped cream and mint leaves if desired.
