

Dear Friends at FPC Coldwater,

What joy it gives me to begin my letter to you in this manner. You ARE new friends and I treasure you. That might be the "take away" in the month of February-the month of LOVE. We are to treasure each other, listen closely when someone is speaking to us, pray for them and their needs and reach out to others in our community that we may not yet know.

The author of LOVE is, of course, Jesus Christ. He is the One who teaches us how to love wholeheartedly, extravagantly, generously. He is the One who demonstrates for us daily how to be in close communion with God. Jesus wants us to start and finish our days with Him, but also to keep Him in the middle as well. How do we do that? By being in prayer (yes, sometimes in our Prayer Closet, but often in the midst of our day, driving the kids or grandkids to a function or to school, running errands for yourself or someone else.) You don't have to close your eyes to pray, you know. And, sometimes a prayerful posture helps us stay focused on our prayer, for example, sitting quietly with our hands folded in our lap, or with our hands open, palm up as we pray and receive from God what He has for us that day. We can pray jogging, riding a bike, before meals, before visiting a person in the hospital (when those restrictions have been lifted). We can actually pray ANYTIME, ANYWHERE. We just have to put God first and focus on Him.

I offer these different modes of prayer because I believe we are to be a "people of prayer". We are to worship in God's "house of prayer". Prayer is important to God and to Jesus. Remember all the times Jesus went off by Himself to pray when life got hectic? We can learn from His behavior and choose to pray when our lives are unraveling.

Jesus longs to be there for us, but we have to open ourselves up to Him and the best way is through prayer. I commend it to you for the month of February. Let's see where the Lord leads us together as we pray.

# Dear Friends in Coldwater First Presbyterian Church,

Hello! This is my first letter out to you and I send it with greetings and love.

Now that we are in the beginnings of 2021 I hope to begin some normal church functions, like committee meetings. Only I choose to call them Team meetings. (No one likes to go to a committee meeting, but everyone wants to be on a winning Team.)

So, here are the Teams I would like to begin in 2021, whenever we are able to resume meeting in person to work for the church. Explanations will accompany these Team titles. My hope is that each of you will want to be part of one or more teams to continue the work of the church of Jesus Christ in Coldwater and beyond.

- ~Worship Team (which includes scene design and non-traditional services) The persons on this Team would enjoy being creative with our visuals as well as the content of worship.
- ~Music Team-The choir, bell choirs, pianist and organist as well as any future choir director would be those most interested in this Team, but not limited to musically advantaged. (This team can be incorporated within the Worship Team until such time as they want to stand alone.)
- ~Discipleship/Christian Education-This team would help the Pastor discern study materials, teachers, opportunities to reach those not yet engaged in Biblical of book studies to strengthen their own faith and the congregation's impact in Coldwater and beyond.
- ~Mission Team-those people who have a heart for helping others, near and far, through hands on work that engages the congregation as well as monetary goals to enhance provision and needs met for others.
- ~Stewardship Team-(previously called the Finance Committee) This team evaluates the income and outgo of the church monies and how they should be allocated. They report to the Session through the Treasurer. (The word Stewardship conjures up the idea of using God's money to the best of our abilities, rather than just a corporation's view of checks and balances).
- ~Technology Team-Those unique individuals for whom computers, laptops, screens and all electrical connections are not a mystery. For those who thrive on electronic challenges. We hope to bring worship services to you in the near future with more technology.

- ~Guest Services Team (Fellowship and Hospitality) This team would oversee church wide functions that include food and or/ hospitality to our congregation or outsiders, (i.e. funeral meals, weddings, etc.) It would also be responsible for welcoming new visitors and prospective members and helping new members become connected with the congregation.
- ~Drama Team-These individuals would enjoy participating in skits (chosen by the pastor), drama, opportunities to involve others in visuals to enhance worship.
- ~Special Events Teams-Those folks who enjoy finding and facilitating group experiences such as concerts within the church or community, group trips to places of interest, etc. They would find, get approval and orchestrate these events with the help of appropriate persons including the Pastor.
- ~Personnel-Persons specifically chosen to serve on the Personnel Team with the pastor to enhance relationships primarily with the staff.

As you can see there are 10 Teams listed here. Ideally, each Team would have 4-5 members, but there could be more. I would LOVE to see everyone at least a little bit involved in the life of their church through these Teams, when and only when it is safe to engage in them. In the meantime, I would love to begin putting names to the teams as you step up to indicate your interest in serving on one of them.

### SUMMARY OF SESSION MEETING, THURSDAY JANUARY 14, 2021

We had a quorum of 7 of our 9 board members,

Pastor Susan opened the meeting at 6:05 PM with prayer.

Susan purchased a book Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations, for us to read and discuss prior to the meeting began. We had a 15 minute discussion on the first chapter.

Velma Cole gave the Treasurers report. The Christmas Eve offering totaled \$1007.00 and a check has been sent to Jacobs Well.

Susan went over her report.

We are looking into changing the time of Church services so that Liz Mowen can continue as our pianist. Her church is currently closed due to COVID but once it reopens she would not be available for our 10:30 service. We will be sending out robo calls asking for the congregation's feelings about the time change. You will be able to contact any of the session members for your thoughts on this.

Family Promise has contacted Susan concerning getting assistance from us and other church's for meals for the homeless. In years past each church would take a week and house them giving them dinner and breakfast. We stopped working with them once we opened the Free Clinic. What they are requesting now is having us buy groceries for 5 evening meals once a month. Family Promise would pick up the groceries and the families would prepare the meals at the residence. We discussed this and feel it is a good mission for us. Susan will also contact the Circles for assistance.

Susan stated she would like to have an Ash Wednesday service and it was decided that a noon service would be better than an evening. This will be Wednesday, February 17<sup>th</sup>. Susan will also be sending out a mailing concerning services.

Paul Hershberger discussed the project of installing screens and projector in the sanctuary to project hymns and scriptures on the screens. They had a meeting in the Sanctuary 2 weeks ago with B.C. Sound the company that could possibly do the installation. It has been decided to contact some other companies and get other bids. Paul will bring this to Session once he has other proposals.

The meeting closed with prayer at 7:00 P M.

# **Game Day Recipes**

For all you Super Bowl Fans

### **Over the Top Nachos** 6 servings

Ingredients

1 pound ground beef

1 onion, finely diced

salt and pepper to taste

2 cups shredded Cheddar cheese

1 (16 ounce) can refried beans

1 (14.5 ounce) package tortilla chips

1 fresh jalapeno pepper, sliced

Directions

Step 1-In a large frying pan, brown ground beef with onion, salt and pepper over medium heat. Break the meat into very small pieces while it is cooking. After the meat is thoroughly cooked, drain off the grease.

Step 2 -Arrange chips on a microwavable platter. Spread beans over the chips. Layer with 1/2 of the cheese, the ground beef mixture, and remaining cheese. Arrange jalapeno peppers on top.

Step 3- Microwave on medium-high until cheese has melted. Serve immediately.

### **Baked Potato Dip**

2 (16 ounce) containers sour cream

1 (3 ounce) can bacon bits

2 cups shredded Cheddar cheese

1 bunch green onions, chopped

**Directions** 

In a medium size mixing bowl, combine sour cream, bacon, Cheddar cheese and green onions; stir well. Refrigerate, or serve immediately.

### Sausage Cheese Dip

Ingredients

1 pound ground pork sausage

1 (2 pound) loaf processed cheese, cubed

1 (8 ounce) container sour cream

1 (10 ounce) can diced tomatoes with green chile peppers, drained

2 green onions, chopped

Directions

Step 1- Place ground pork sausage in a large, deep skillet. Cook over medium high heat until evenly brown.

Step 2 -In a medium saucepan over medium heat, melt processed cheese.

Step 3Drain sausage and mix in a medium bowl with the melted processed cheese, sour cream, diced tomatoes with greenchile peppers and green onions.


