Clerk Lewis read a request from Cindy Fickle for the Humane Society to use our parking lot January 18th for a fund raiser for the Humane Society. They build dog Houses and then volunteers spend the night. This request was approved. They did this in 2015 also.

Bruce Gregory was in attendance to go over final figures on the Calvin Hall roof repair and the spring work to be done for drainage in the parking lot and repairs to our sidewalks to be done by Parrish Excavating. The Calvin Hall roof work has been completed as of this afternoon. The work on the eaves on the south side of the church may begin next week weather permitting.

FPC's Outreach Report

What an exciting year for the Outreach Committee.

At the beginning of 2019 the Diaper Pantry had served 734 children and 47 adults. With the total support of FPC Congregation the Diaper Pantry supplied 1926 children's diapers and 108 adult diapers in 2019 making the totals since the opening 2660 children and 155 adult.

The Branch County Food Pantry has also had wonderful support from FPC. 1853 pounds of food was collected in 2019. This amount does not include the 1221 cake mixes that were collected for the Holiday Box Challenge!

Chicken Dumpling Soup-

Ingredients

4-chicken breast, cut in bite pieces and browned

2- stalks of celery, sliced 3- medium size carrots. sliced

4- medium potatoes, cut in bite size pieces

1- small to medium onion chopped

2 tbls parsley

1 large carton of chicken broth or gluten free chicken broth 1 to 2 cups Bisquick, or Gluten Free Bisquick, follow the instructions on the box for dumplings

Directions

Sauté in olive oil the chicken, onion, celery, carrots and potatoes in a large soup pan. Add the broth and bring to a low boil, add parsley. Roll the Bisquick mixture into small balls and drop the balls into the broth. Let cook until all vegetables are tender. If the broth gets thicker than you like after the dumplings has cooked for awhile add more broth or water to thin it out.

Loaded Baked Potato Soup

Ingredients

12 slices bacon

2/3 cup margarine

2/3 cup all-purpose flour or gluten free flour 7 cups milk

4 large baked potatoes, peeled and cubed

4 green onions, chopped 1 1/4 cups shredded Cheddar cheese

1 cup sour cream

1 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon ground black pepper

Directions

Place bacon in a large, deep skillet. Cook over medium heat until browned. Drain, crumble, and set aside. In a stock pot or Dutch oven, melt the margarine over medium heat. Whisk in flour until smooth. Gradually stir in milk, whisking constantly until thickened. Stir in potatoes and onions. Bring to a boil, stirring frequently. Reduce heat, and simmer 10 minutes. Mix in bacon, cheese, sour cream, salt, and pepper. Continue cooking, stirring frequently, until cheese is melted.

Lasagna Soup
The tomato-y broth, brimming with sausage & pasta, melts the mix of cheeses placed in each bowl before serving; a quick swirl of the spoon ensures a bit of gooey cheese in every bite... Ingredients:

2 tsp Olive oil

1 ½ lb Sweet Italian sausage (casings removed)

2 Onions, finely chopped 4 Garlic cloves, minced

2 tsp Oregano

½ tsp Red paper flakes

2 T Tomato paste

1 28-oz can, diced tomatoes

6 cups Chicken broth

2 Bay leaves

8 oz Fusilli pasta (cooked and rinsed with cold water) (Or any Gluten free pasta)

½ cup Fresh basil, finely chopped

8 oz Ricotta

½ cup Grated Parmesan

½ tsp Salt

Pinch Pepper

2 cups Shredded mozzarella

Directions:

In a large pot heat olive oil over medium heat

Add sausage and sauté, breaking into small pieces with wooden spoon, until sausage is no longer pink (5-7)

Add onions and sauté until softened (about six minutes)

Add garlic, oregano, and red pepper flakes, and sauté for one minute

Add tomato paste and sauté until paste turns a rusty brown (about four minutes)

Add tomatoes with their juice, the broth and the bay leaves and bring the soup to a boil

Reduce heat and simmer for about 30 minutes


Stir in basil, then simmer 10-15 minutes

In a small bowl, combine ricotta, parmesan, ¼ tsp of salt and pinch of pepper

To serve, place 1 ½ T or ricotta mixture in each serving bowl, sprinkle with a little mozzarella, and ladle soup on top

Note: This is one of my husbands favorite soups.
